What a lovely way to start the new year with our **Whanau Day**, relaxed, a time to chat, meet and greet and most importantly getting to know who we all are. It was fantastic to see all our parents, caregivers and extended whanau in our kura or school. We value your

partnership and see this as an important key for your tamariki or child's success. A big thank you to our student leaders who did a great job greeting and surveying our whanau and the P.T.A who organised and cooked 500 sausages, on what, was one of the hottest days this summer...PHEW hot HOT work!

On the day we had a 109 people who completed the **whanau survey** and we would love to share with you what we found out. The great things we do were generally good communication, good stance on bullying, nice grounds, approachable team, an inclusive culture, supportive to students and parents, and most people love all the extra stuff their child gets to do such as kapa haka, skiing, trips and camp. Of the 5 areas in STEAM our parents wanted to see more Science taught followed by technology and then environmental studies. Some



other considerations were air conditioning in hot classrooms, longer notification around events so as to be able to arrange time off work, more outdoor education/sports, more information around how the curriculum is set and a question around breakfast club. Great responses and we'll be addressing all of your feedback. I'm really excited about the Science in 2019. This year

Sarah Keehan will be completing her masters and has taken study leave to do this. When Sarah returns she'll be taking classes when teachers are on release to do Science! Sarah is a Science expert and this is a real passion of hers. Room 5 will be our new school wide Science Lab where Sarah will teach your child...I can't wait and this starts in term 3! In the meantime, we have two other passionate

Scientist on staff who run our Science lunchtime club, Liz France and Lisa Pellowe. The board has also invested part of this years budget into using science kits in all rooms. These kits are set up with all the materials, plans and learning outcomes...ready to go! We trialled these last year and our kids just loved them. Science is all go!



Powhiri-Tomorrow we will be welcoming all our new tamariki/children, whanau/parents and staff with a powhiri. All welcome and this includes extended whanau too. For those who are not aware of what a powhiri is? It's an official welcome to Taupo Primary with a gathering of all to welcome you and your child to their learning journey in the hall, followed by a cup of tea and some kai or food in the staffroom afterwards. We start at 9.15am in the school hall where new children,

parents, caregivers, staff wait outside the hall until they are called in. Our teaching staff will be outside to help tell you what the process is and join you. Haere mai te kura o Taupo Primary...Welcome to Taupo Primary.

Some people find the word 'interviews' rather daunting and old fashioned...we would prefer to say **Whanau Korero** this year. These will take place in week 5. We would love to see all our parents, caregivers and whanau during this time. This is a time to have a general korero/chat with you around your child's learning needs/goals in 2019, any concerns or questions you may have, or to see if we have what we think is right for you and your child, or have we missed something you would like us to focus on this year. We'll leave it up to you whether you would like your child to come too. Please use the online booking to make a time that is suitable for you or pop in to see the office or your child's teacher and we'll get you sorted.

Road Patrol-please be patient with our new Road Patrollers who have just started this year and are learning the ropes in regards to this important job. The most important rule in which they have been trained by Constable Tash is to only open the signs when traffic is behind the diamonds painted on the road. We all need to be mindful that this rule applies to foot traffic too. If the road patrollers on on duty then foot traffic inside the diamond zones must use the crossing too. Please help us by being role models and use the crossing.

Zones of Regulation-this week at our staff meeting we looked at Zones of Regulation this is a school wide program that compliments our PB4L or Positive Behaviour for Learning program we use at Taupo Primary. Zones of Regulation is about teaching and giving our kids the skills and tools they need to cope with their emotions so they know what to do when they are feeling angry, sad or frustrated. As adults we learn or know what to do or how to relax and unwind. However, some of our kids find this difficult so we need to help give them the skills to do this. More information will be coming out over the next few weeks, ask your child or child's teacher as they start to explore this in their classroom.



Assemblies


