Tena koutou katoa,

What's happening this year for our children and in our kura/school 2019? The school has completed its charter which outlines the strategic aims or plans for student achievement and well being. Within this is our annual plan or what we will be working on this year as a school. This is available on our website should you like to know more. However, in a nutshell around student achievement the school is focusing on writing as a whole and oral language. This is an area of need for our kids and our community in general. All schools work together as a CoL or a Community of Learning and writing is the focus across the town in all primary, intermediate and high schools.

This week we have Renee a facilitator working with our leadership team on our school literacy

plan...we can't wait. Along with our learning needs we will continue to develop a STEAM curriculum with Kay Stevenson from the University of Waikato. Part of our curriculum will focus on being localised. This is utilising our rich geothermal wonderland or Taupo. As a school we would love to see Ngati Tuwharetoa education resources that have been developed form part our rich curriculum...these resources are fantastic!

At our next board of trustees meeting Peter Moyle (Principal from Taupo-nui-a-tia) will be sharing with us the CoL strategic plan developed across our town by all the schools. Anyone is welcome to attend should you like to know more about this.

Property- the school fence has been completed and the gate at this end of the school is now available to be used again. A big thank you to Steel Worx, Suzi from Opus and our wonderful Board for keeping our kids safe...the new fence looks great!

Part of the property work that's not so exciting, but must be done is a new water mains pipe in an area of the school. This will address the low pressure of



water in areas and a mysterious leak somewhere? Along with this room 10 will be upgraded and hopefully covered decks will be going in along rooms 11 and 10. The board are also looking at heating and cooling of classrooms and what can be done to address the summer heat and the winter chills.

Whanau Korero-what a fantastic way to start your child's learning journey in 2019 with a chat around your tamaiti or child. It is at these hui or meetings that we learn more about your child and I know many of our TPS staff found out information they would never have known. We see these relationships as an essential key to your tamaiti or child's success. Thank you for attending and sharing with us....te reira i te mahi ngātahi (it's a partnership).

P.T.A- Last week the school received a cheque for \$5000.00 dollars to go towards the purchasing of our robotics from the P.T.A. **THANK YOU from all of us.** These funds have allowed the school to purchase enough robotics so that whole class teaching can take place. We now have full sets of blue bots, sphero, and dash. Exciting!!!! We would love to have a STEAM celebration sometime this year where your child could teach you how to use the robotics...we would love to invite our fundraising P.T.A team in before then so they can see how their hard work has paid off! Basketball


