Skiing-We are starting to get organised for skiing this year. At this stage we are looking at taking a group of approximately 30 year 5/6 students up the mountain during the ski season for regular lessons, but this is dependent on parent help and transport costs. Netball Uniforms- a number of new uniforms have been purchased the very last of the red and black stock that we could get our hands on (no longer being made). Please look after our new uniforms. Enjoy the season girls! Thanks mums who are coaching our teams during lunchtimes and after school.

Attendance- please do not be offended if we contact you regarding your child's absences. We need to do our job and this is never pleasant. However, the ministry tolerance is 10% or roughly 5 days per term. 20 days over the year. This is actually a large amount of time as a worker we are only entitled to 5. We are contacting a number of children who are missing up to 40% of time. They are essentially missing 4 months of school. We will be referring these learners to ROCK ON for support. Rock on is the community group working with the




police around attendance. We can't do this alone. Please support us and send your child to school. This has a huge impact on your child's learning. Some of these children are in our learning support programs when another could be in there instead. We will be looking at placing children who attend on these programs in term 2. Programs cost thousands of dollars to run and we need our tamariki present to achieve success for them.

School Achievement Challenge- Our biggest achievement challenge for our school and our tamariki is 'Writing'. We have a large proportion of learners who need support in this part of their literacy. We are mainly focusing on are our year 6 and 3 learners in 2019. *What are we doing about this?* This term we have been working with Renae from 'Write that Essay' a writing program we have adopted as a school and a community of learning across all Taupo Schools or the CoL. Teachers have started coaching sessions and are released to attend these as part of their professional learning. Leaders are working in the background now to run the school ALL program (accelerated literacy learning in writing). This program will start in rooms across the school during terms 2 and 3. Our year 3 and 4 cohort last year who received this program showed amazing results and this is why we are pushing the program school wide. A big thank you to Kirsty Tatere, Janice Bowman, Trevor Harvey and Melanie Matthews who are leading this for us. Colleen Wills will be working with the school to support the program and coach our teaching staff. There is more coming next term...we will keep you posted.

This whakatauki is dedicated to Cushla this week as she was a leader who nurtured so many and allowed them to blossom.
