Last week we had the Education Review Office at school or **ERO**. They spent four days working with us and in our kids rooms chatting to them about learning. The main aim of ERO is to look at student achievement and outcomes for all. They focus on those that need more support and look at ethnicities and genders to identify any disparity. From here they make recommendations. For us at Taupo Primary School it's our boys. Our girls achieve good results compared to our boys. Some recommendations will come out around this which ERO refer to as disparity or inequity...it's about creating equitable outcomes for all learners. Recommendations are great to help focus the schools goals and plans moving forward. Along with this ERO make recommendations for all sectors teaching staff, leadership and the board. Our report will take several weeks from here and we will send it out to our community once we get it.

**ENROLMENT- You live out of Zone and would like your child to attend TPS in 2020?** If you have children at home who you want to attend Taupo Primary School in 2020 and now live out of Zone, then, you will be required to go into a ballot. At this point in time we are calling for any possible names to go to the office and register an expression of interest for 2020. We will need this as a rough estimation for spaces or numbers. Once these spaces have been set by the board then that is it. **Please talk to anyone you know who has a child at home out of zone and needs to go into a ballot for a space in 2020 and register in the office!** Thank you. There will be tighter guidelines around this in 2020.

**Uniforms-** please send your child to school in their correct uniform. If you are missing your child's uniform please check the lost property located at the end of room 15 by the senior playground. The lost property box is full of stuff...it has to belong to someone!

**Garden to Table-** our kids have been busy cooking up a storm in the kitchen and sharing the kai they prepared! A big thank you to our two grandads who support us each week and get out and about planting with our Garden to Table groups.

Assistive Technology- some of our children have been privileged to receive an assistive device to support their learning at school. These devices are to remain at school for the child to use whilst at school. Apologies if you think that these devices are coming home to be used at home as they have never been used this way previously. Devices follow the child through their school life and are transferred from one school to the next.





Taupo Primary School along with many other schools nationwide are helping to get our **Paralympic team** to the games with a mufti day to raise funds that they're short of. This Friday it's mufti day with a gold coin donation! All proceeds are to help our team get to the games! Let's be generous whanau!

Attendance and Lateness- At the start of term 3 we received our attendance and lateness report from the MOE here are some of the findings...I feel it's important for us all to address this as this is rather alarming...and has a huge impact on our students achievement and wellbeing.

**Lateness-** In term 2 of 2019, 75.7% of male students and 71.4% of female students were on time to over 98% of classes attended.



**Attendance-** The percentage of students attending regularly was highest in term 2 of 2018 (61.2%) and lowest in term 2 of 2019 (47.2%). This means that just over 50% of the school is considered to have poor attendance last term.

**Property-** recently half the back field was sold to Toi Ohomai to build their new campus and facility. From the sale of this back field Taupo Primary School will be receiving extra monies to go into property. Watch this space! Room 6/7 and 11 upgrades are going out for tender this term as the designs and plans have been completed. We are hoping to have these started next term or early next year. We have also been accepted for the LED lights up-grade on all our school buildings which will take place in early 2020...yay and all paid for by the ministry...thanks to the MOE! So, lots of lovely new property developments will be coming up for our school!

Wanted - more GIRLS to play Touch Rugby. Forms available from the office.






### Library News
