Come along and join the tradition of planting at beautiful Whakaipō Bay.


The Girl Guides have been doing it for 30 years! They'll be there to celebrate, and everyone is welcome!


Bring your gumboots, garden gloves, spade and suitable wet weather gear, 'cause we'll be planting rain or shine!
