


Taupo Primary School Newsletter Thursday 19 September 2019, Week 9 'Ko te ako te maneatanga' or 'Hooked on Learning'

Kapa Haka- The Taupo primary representatives have done an impeccable job at the Tuwharetoa festival. Their Waiata and Haka were very impressive.

Conservation week- Could everyone pick up at least one piece of rubbish a day! If everyone contributes, even for one week we would pick up **3,500** pieces of rubbish!

<u>Senior school</u> In Room 21 they have have been building marble orientated mini games out of cardboard, from catapults to tunnel runs. In Room 16 they have been learning about conservation week. They have been making traps and games as well as bird watching.
