Anaru attended the school board meeting on Tuesday to share his thoughts around future planning and how to focus on language, culture and identity, not just for Maori but for all our multicultural ethnicities. We have over 30 identified ethnic groups here at TPS all of which we need to celebrate.

Colleen has been working with our Associate Principal Kirsty Tatere and looking at our school data from the ALL program (accelerated literacy learning) we ran across the school this year. More will come out to the community about this soon. We have been amazed with the uptake from our boys in this program. It really gives them a recipe for writing they love!

TAUPO PRIMARY SCHOOL GROCERY HAMPER



The PTA is putting together a Grocery raffle so what we would like is for every child to contribute an item towards a Taupo Primary School Raffle.

To ensure we get a good range of items we have divided the rooms and specified what category we would like everybody in each class to bring. We ask that you think outside the square even for something different if you want. Remember no perishables like fresh fruit or vegetables or anything that needs refrigeration. Below is a guideline to what we would like to see from each class but don't worry - if you have something you'd like to donate that another class has been allocated that is fine just bring what you have along and all will be gratefully received.

We will package up all the goodies into one big trolley and then ideally another 10-15 smaller prizes depending on donations so we can spread the love. Each child will be allocated 10 tickets each to sell for \$2.00 each.

Donations will be collected from now until the 15th November and raffles sent home that week so we can draw it on 24th November - just in time for Christmas.

All tickets sold and unsold must be returned by the 24thth November to the Office.

Room 1 and 2 - A can of tinned food whether it be tinned fruit, spaghetti, sweet corn, tomatoes or anything else you find or prefer.

Room 3 - Party food like chips or reduced cream/onion soup, nuts, crackers, pretzels, fizzy drinks

Room 7 - Breakfast products - non-perishable like jam, spreads, cereals or porridge.

Room 8 and 9 - Sweet tooth products like lollies, biscuits, chocolate.

Room 10, 11 and 12 - Lunchbox food - packaged like muesli bars, multi packs chippies, le snaks, raisins, dried apricots.

Room 13 - laundry - could be pegs, laundry powder, fabric softener, scrubbing brush, laundry basket or even a bucket.

<u>Room 14 and 15</u> - Bathroom/toilet products - cleaning products like Jif, bar of soap, foaming soap, smellies for toilet, toilet paper, tissues, toothpaste or toothbrushes, spray & wipe, toilet duck or even a flannel.

Room 16 and 17 - Health & beauty products ranging from hair ties to moisturizer, shampoo, conditioner, nail polish or any other pamper items.

Room 18 and 19 - Kitchen cleaning products - could be anything from a dishcloth, tea towel, dishwasher tablets to spray in wipe, dishwasher liquid or handy towels.

Room 20 and 21 - Staples and baking items like flour, salt, pepper, oil, tea, coffee, sugar, milo, baking powder, cocoa, brown sugar, coconut, noodles, herbs and spices, cup of soup.

If anyone has a basket or display box lying around that they would like to donate that would be appreciated too (to use to package prizes).
