Class Placement and Visits

Board of Trustees, School Policy Term 4 Review

Taupo Primary Cohort Entry

We are passionate about ensuring our students have a successful transition from Early Childhood Education to Taupō Primary School. For this reason we are implementing cohort entry in 2020. This means that children will be able to start school in cohorts but only **after** they have turned 5.

There will be **2 entry points per term**, one on the first day of term, and one at a mid-point during a term. Cohort entry is about helping children settle better in school. There is evidence that starting school alongside other children helps build relationships and supports a smoother entry to school life.

Parents will continue to have the option of not starting their child in school until their 6th birthday. It is a legal requirement that a child enrols at a registered school from age 6. Therefore, if not already enrolled, a child can start school on their 6th birthday regardless of a school's cohort entry policy, but must start school no later than their 6th birthday.
