Friendly Mask Reminder

We are so proud of how well our tamariki and staff have adapted to wearing masks at school.

Public health advice is that an appropriate face covering will fit snugly and seal well around facial contours. This can include single use, disposable masks and reusable fabric masks with three layers.

It is your responsibility to provide a mask for your child, however we currently have a limited number of masks that we can provide students with if they lose or forget theirs. We will provide spares and ask students without a valid exemption to wear these. **PLEASE NAME MASKS.**

If your child has an exemption and you have not let the office know please do so asap. Students will be allocated a mask and expected to wear it if we have not heard from a parent or caregiver.

PROTECT PIKI TE ORA	<p>YOUR WHAKAPAPA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have phone and zoom catch-ups with whānau and friends • Reach out if you need help, you are not alone • Be like our tupuna, resilient and strong • Kōiri te parore haere - stay home, don't roam! <p>YOUR HOUSE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Set the tikanga for your whare so everyone knows how to manaaki each other if someone gets sick • Make sure manuhiri know your tikanga, put signs up • Make sure your alarms and safety devices are working • Make sure you have the Tū-Whare-Ora Manaaki pack ready • Set up your whare to minimise the spread of Covid e.g. map out isolation areas, list of household instructions e.g. who feeds the cat, consider using a tent as isolation with supplies
PREPARE PIKI TE KAHA	<p>YOUR WHĀNAU</p> <p>Have a whānau plan that includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • List on fridge of whānau details e.g. names, ages, medical conditions • Name someone who can shop for you and pick up medicines • Have karakia • Consider who will look after the tamariki while their caregiver is in isolation • Make sure the Tū-Whare-Ora Manaaki pack is stocked with essential supplies including kai and wai <p>YOUR WHARE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure isolation zones are away from shared spaces • Consider another whānau whare for group isolation <p>YOUR PĀTAKA</p> <p>Stock up your pātaka:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medical • Hygiene supplies • Cleaning • Baby requirements • Pet requirements • Māra kai
INFORM PIKI TE MĀRAMATANGA	<p>YOURSELF</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do your research, make sure your information sources are trustworthy • Poiopio to wairua <p>YOUR WHĀNAU</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep talking to your whānau especially your tamariki • Discuss how to manage this situation as a whānau • Reflect and share the learnings from your families past • Poiopio ōu pakeke <p>OTHERS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Update your emergency contact list and put it on the fridge
