


I hope everyone managed to get a break, rest and enjoy the stunning weather we had over the school holidays.

CPF Orange Level Need to Knows

Masks are no longer mandatory, however they are recommended by the Government. At this point of time masks at TPS are optional in most situations (More details and information on Masks on page 2).

School Breaks - we are not operating morning tea and lunch in smaller groups, so we are back to our normal break times - 11am and 1pm.

Reduced number of non essential visitors on sight - we are still asking parents to drop off and pick up at the gate as much as possible. If parents are onsite for any reason we would appreciate you wearing a mask and not entering classes without the invitation of the teacher.

Making an appointment to chat with staff is still essential. The easiest way to do this is to Email the staff member concerned to arrange. Some teachers may still prefer virtual or phone conversations as opposed to face to face. Please respect our staffs preferences at this time.

CPF Orange Level Need to Knows

Assemblies - large indoor gatherings are still advised against. However, should we still be seeing a declining number of covid cases we will allow smaller group assemblies to take place ie team assemblies. Parents may be invited to these if relevant and appropriate space for social distancing is available.

Sick Students or Students with Symptoms

As per CPF red, if your child is sick or has symptoms keep them at home (even if they have already had covid). If a child presents sick or with symptoms at school, you will be asked to collect them and keep them at home until symptom free. Please note that within our younger students, sore tummy and/ or vomiting has been a very common sign of covid at TPS.

Singing and Dancing Indoors - with ventilation and some social distancing it is deemed that singing indoors can happen - this has made many teachers very happy!

Stand-by Mask - Please ensure students in year 4 and up have a mask in their bag or at school daily. There may be times when they are asked to wear them ie if gathering in large numbers indoors or in the sick bay.

Masks - Further conversation



While masks are currently optional at school for staff and students we are still wanting to promote a culture that masks are encouraged, accepted and respected. Students and staff who wish to wear masks will feel accepted and empowered to do so.

We continue to ask that parents and visitors wear a mask onsite, especially if you are inside with other staff, students or adults. Thank you to everyone that has continued to wear masks around our teachers and students.

Students **may be** asked to wear a mask in different circumstances. These could include large assemblies, gatherings inside in small spaces etc. Students year 4+ will be asked to wear a mask in the sick bay. Please remind your child to calmly and politely inform / remind the teacher or staff member if they are exempt **or** you do not want them to wear a mask. Teachers will take this at face value and **may** follow it up with communication home just to confirm.
