Taupo Primary School - Covid-19 Vaccination Status Risk Review / Consultation

Taupo Primary School and the Board of Trustees are undertaking a **risk review** with regard to employing, engaging or utilising **staff who are not vaccinated** (or up to date with boosters). As directed by the Ministry of Education, this risk review is specifically to identify risk within **our own** school community.

As part of this review we are looking to identify the level of risk an unvaccinated staff member may pose to our school community.

If there are serious / ongoing health factors within your family that may be impacted by engagement with unvaccinated staff **and** you feel need it needs to be considered by the School and Board; you will have an opportunity to share this information in the digital survey being sent by email and online. Please have these completed by Thursday 26th May.

School Field Update



Over the holidays, the field contractors and grass experts completed another round of scheduled maintenances (to address depressions from soil settling and compaction, further attention to drainage lines and irrigation, and undersowing the entire field). Those areas were cordoned off to allow grass growth, however this increased the level of use in other areas and the project managers have had to close the field to allow the undersowing to take. We are hopeful this will only be for a couple of weeks.
