Keeping Ourselves Safe Starting Week 5 School Wide

Kia ora e te whanau.

Keeping Ourselves Safe is part of our Health and P.E. programs and is delivered across the school every 2nd year. The program is designed by the NZ Police and teachers deliver their program accordingly. Alongside the school delivering the program will be our local community police officer Constable Tash. Constable Tash will be working with staff, whanau and delivering lessons in the classrooms. We welcome all our whanau, parents and caregivers to an information hui being held at school on Thursday 25th August at 6.30-8.00pm.

What part do parents, caregivers and whānau play?

Parents and whānau are strongly encouraged to support Keeping Ourselves Safe.

- You can attend our meeting at school Thursday 25th August 6.30-8.00pm to tell you more about Keeping
 Ourselves Safe.
- You can find out about abuse and what to do if you think a child you know is being abused.
- You can talk to your child about what they have learnt in Keeping Ourselves Safe.
- You can set safety guidelines with your family.
- You can help young children with the Keeping Ourselves Safe activities they bring home.
- You can give the same safety messages as the school is giving.

What will children and young people learn?

They will learn:

- to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules.

They will know:

- that abuse is never okay
- that abuse is never their fault.

In term 3, Senior School students complete a passion project based on each student's interests. Passion Projects are investigative activities which help unlock students' passions and allow them to find joy in the learning process.

Every week, classes spend time researching their passions and sharing their learning. Students plan and manage their own learning project - gathering information, developing learning skills, creating, discussing and refining their work.

Teachers become mentors and coaches, who facilitate in-depth learning and support students in each step of the inquiry process.
