
Drama and Art Combine

The Awa team have had a busy term so far learning about the phases of the moon and how these affect when to plant different plants. Students kept a moon diary, watched videos and read stories about the different phases. Braxton explains - " when it's a new moon its best to plant leafy plants. When it's a full moon it's time to plant things that grow under the ground." Our next steps are to use our learning to plant a vegetable garden. Classes have also been acting out the story of Horomatangi, and creating their own taniwha puppets and artworks based on myths and legends. April-Rose said - "It was lots of fun doing drama and being the different characters." Room 13 made some colourful taniwha puppets. Room 14 listened to the story of Rona and the Moon and then created colourful tattooed moons. With Matariki only a few weeks away, classes have also started learning about the different stars.

















Big Ball Skills

Students have been learning to dribble, catch, throw and pass as part of our Big Ball skills unit. Rugby and Soccer have been the main activities with whānau coming in to support the learning of these skills.

Bringing Maths to Life
