We are currently dealing with a high level of teacher illness and absence. On top of that, there's a nationwide shortage of teachers and relievers, which means it's not always easy to find someone to step in when needed.

We want to reassure you that we're doing our very best to keep things running smoothly – you'll often see our senior leadership team jumping into classrooms to help out wherever we can.

To the Taupō Community - From Your Local School Principals

Kia ora Taupō whānau,

Like you, we all want Taupō to continue being the best place it can be to live, work, and go to school. Our schools play a vital role in that vision — shaping the futures of our young people and strengthening our community. As the Principals and Boards of schools across the Taupō rohe, we write together to share an urgent issue affecting all our kura — the national shortage of qualified teachers.

Despite our ongoing efforts to recruit and support new staff, there is an increasing teacher supply challenge to meet the growing needs of our schools. This is putting a real strain on our ability to deliver the quality education our ākonga deserve.

Across the rohe, some schools are having to make difficult decisions: collapsing classes, combining year levels, or rostering students home. These measures are temporary and only taken when absolutely necessary, but we know they cause disruption for students, whānau, and staff.

Still, our commitment remains strong — to provide safe, high-quality learning environments for all. Yet at times, the staffing shortage means we cannot meet even our own expectations.

To give context:

- The average number of NZ-trained applicants per vacancy has halved since 2019.
- Around one-third of school vacancies remain unfilled.
- 33% of advertised roles in 2023 had no NZ-trained applicants; 31% had only one.
- Relief teacher availability is at record lows for our community.

You are invited to Taupo Primary School on Thursday 5th June at 9.15am to attend a Mihi Whakatau to welcome our new tamariki/children, whānau/families and kaimahi/staff to our kura/school

As manuhiri/visitors, you will be asked if you would like to korero/speak on behalf of the group. If this interests you, please email either Jasmine Griffin jasmineg@taupoprimary.school.nz or Sarah Sade sarahs@taupoprimary.school.nz. If you would like support on what to include in your korero, just indicate this in your email. However, if no one would like to speak, one of our students will speak on your behalf. After the korero, it is tikanga/protocol to sing a waiata/song, which will be Tutira mai ngā iwi. The school will join in and sing along.

Please meet outside the school hall at 9.10am to be briefed on the Mihi Whakatau process before we begin. Once the Mihi Whakatau process is completed it is tikanga to end with kai/food, so please allow 5-10 minutes to have a cup of tea and biscuit afterwards. We look forward to seeing you there.

Mihi Whakatau process




Meet outside the school hall at 9.10am. You will then walk in as a roopu/group-wahine/females at the front and tane/males behind.

When inside, tane are seated at the front and wahine behind (our tamariki will be with their teacher on the floor).

There will be a kaikorero/speaker from the tangata whenua side, followed by a waiata. Then, a kaikorero will reply from the manuhiri side with a waiata. This may repeat until all speakers have finished.

Manuhiri will then greet tangata whenua with a hariru (hongi, handshake, etc) and make their way to the staffroom for a shared kai.

WHAT TO DONATE

Here's a suggestion of what you might like to donate to the mid winter Christmas raffle. But anything is much appreciated!

Room 1, 2 & 3 - Tinned food OR party food like chips or reduced cream/onion soup, nuts, crackers, pretzels, fizzy drinks.

Room 4, 5, 6 - Breakfast products - non-perishable like jam, spreads, cereals or porridge.

Room 7, 8 & 9 - Sweet tooth products like Iollies, biscuits, chocolate.

Room 10 & 11 & 12 - Lunchbox food - packaged like muesli bars, multi packs chippies, le snaks, raisins, dried apricots.

Room 13 - laundry/cleaning - could be pegs, laundry powder, fabric softener, scrubbing brush, laundry basket or even a bucket!
